1874 -1963

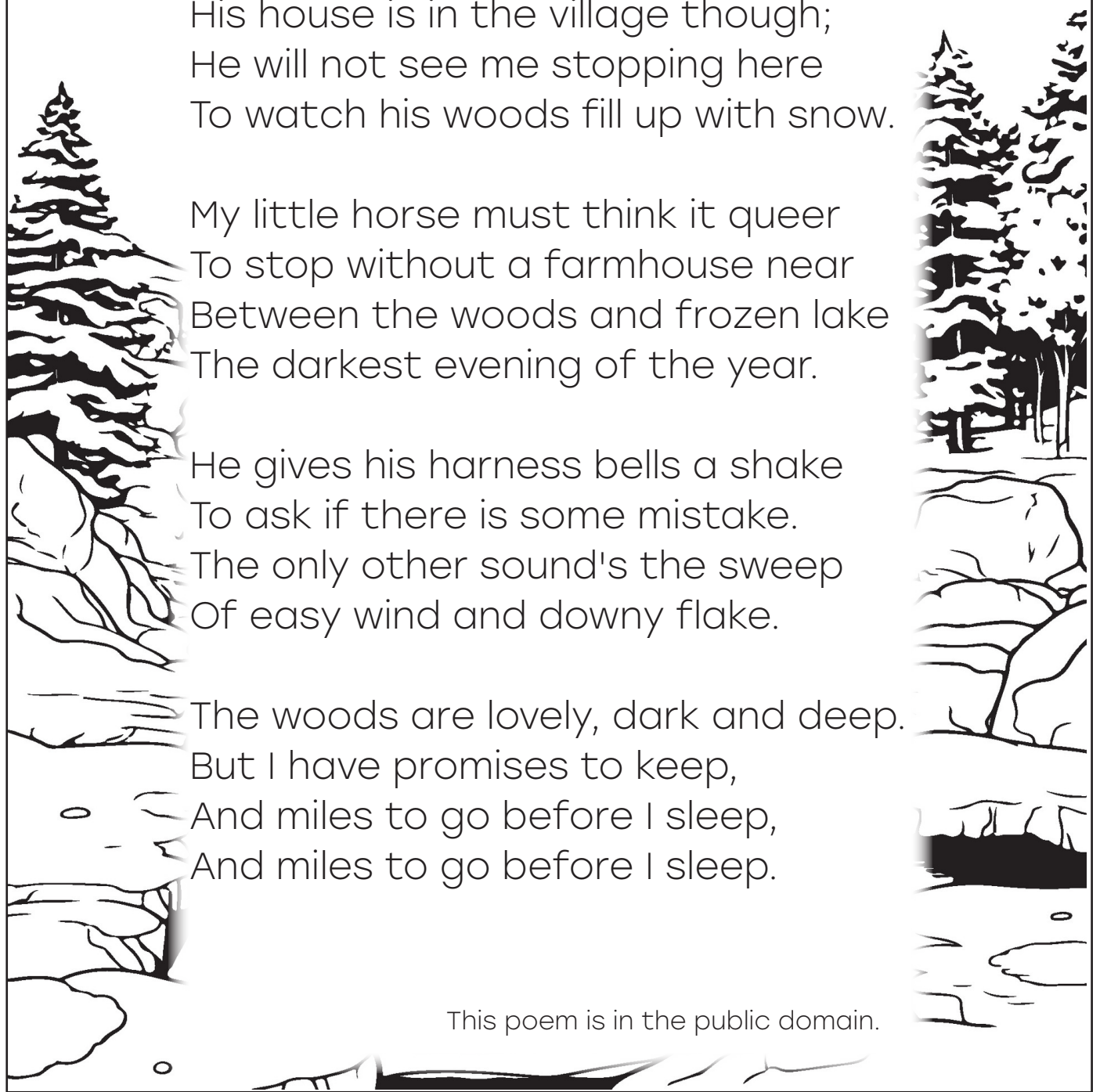
Whose woods these are I think I know.

Of easy wind and downy flake.

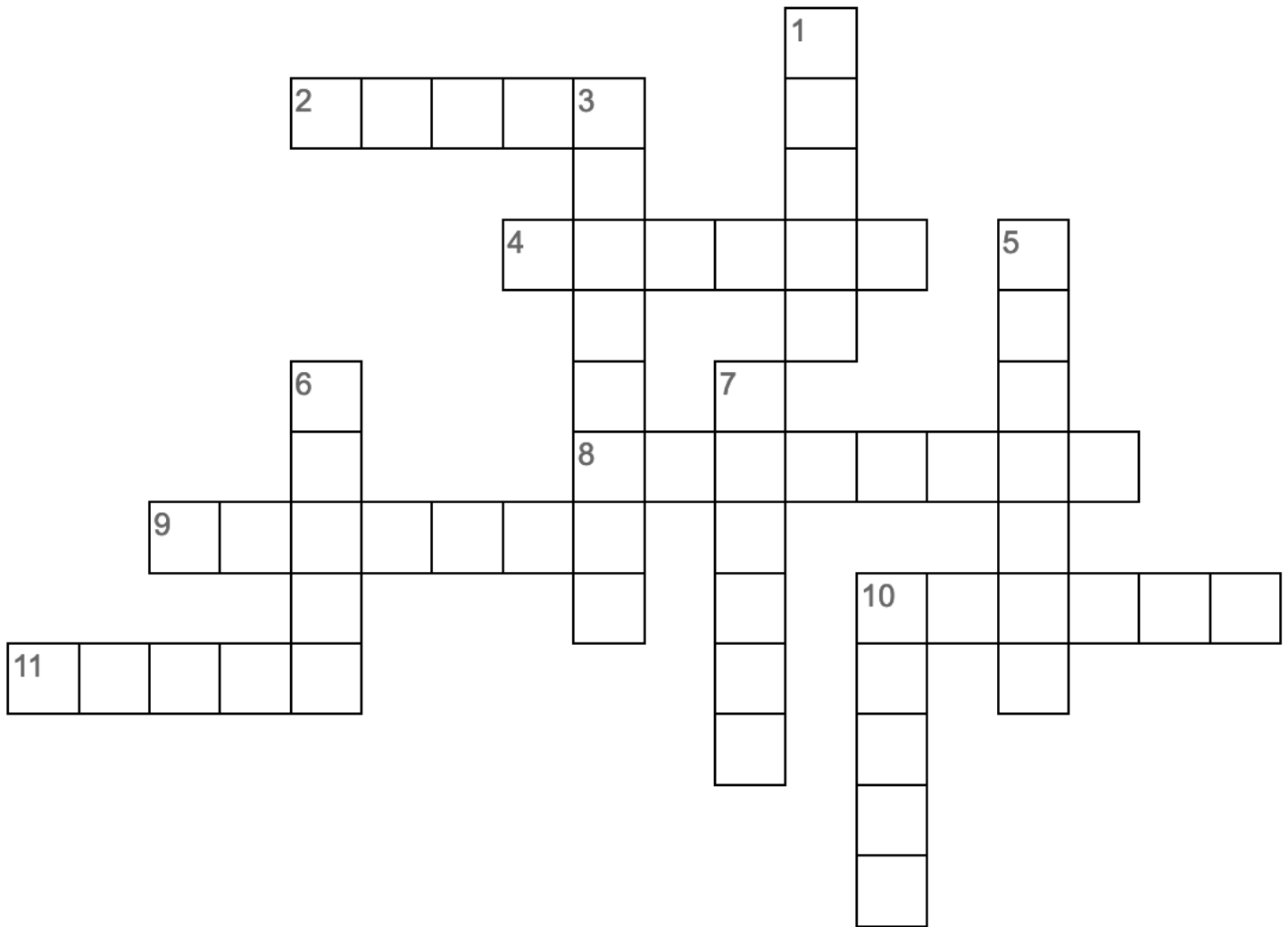
The woods are lovely, dark and deep.

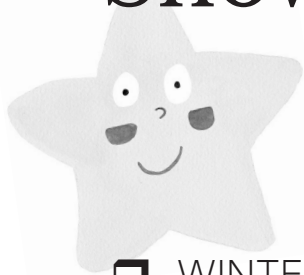

What am I, filled with knights, pirates, or pearls?

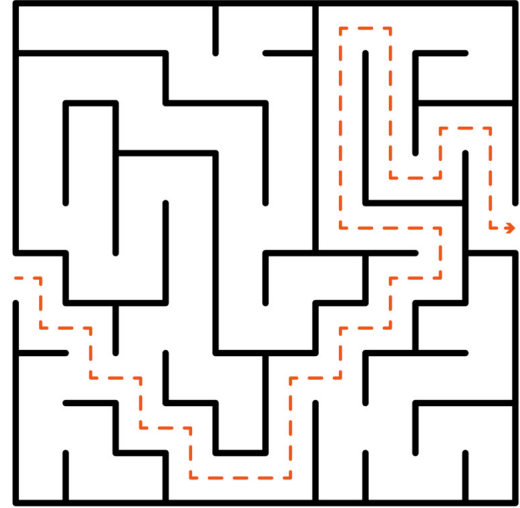
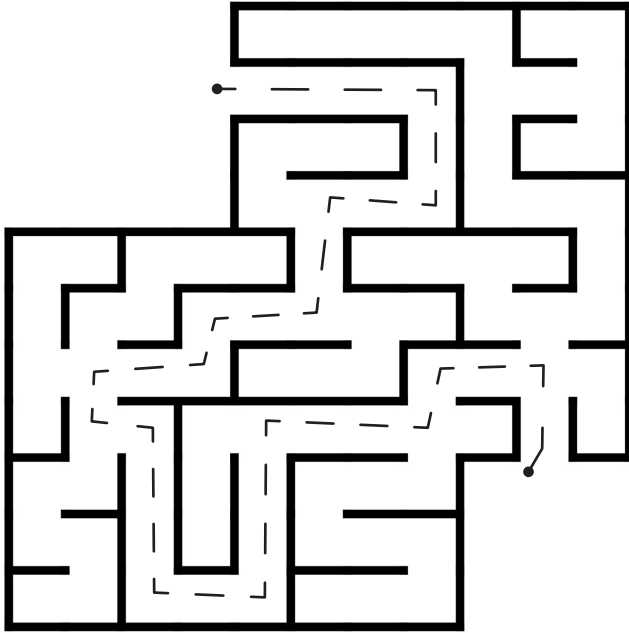

What time is it to explore?



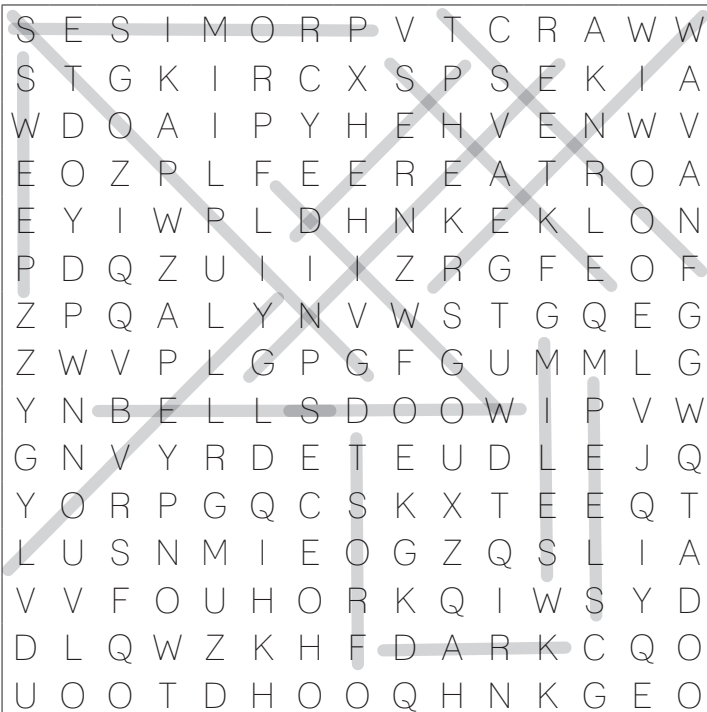

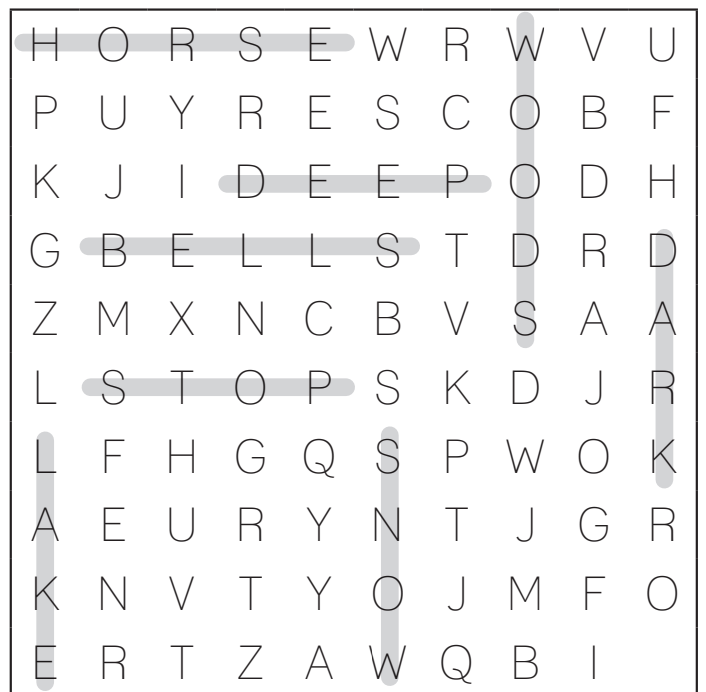
