I'd think shame to stick to nursie as that shadow sticks to me!

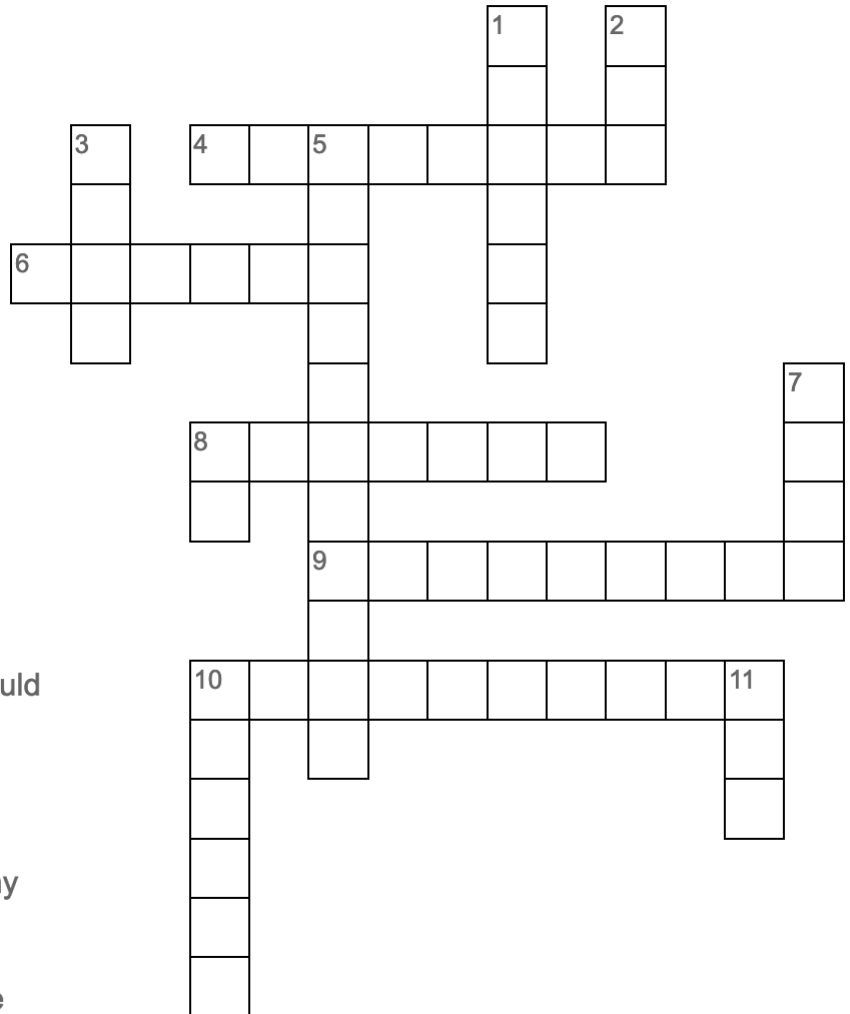
One morning, very early, before the sun was up,
