Watch Me Write

"The Five Senses: My Summer Vacation"

For younger children, use the **Watch Me Draw**.

All of us have what are called the five senses: what we **see, touch, smell, hear,** and **taste**. These senses help us experience the world and help us with how we describe things to each other. When you describe your bedroom to a friend, if you say something like, "The walls are **green**. I have a **fluffy** bean bag chair. I have a **cinnamon** air freshener. You can hear the birds **tweeting** in a tree outside. And I keep a jar of candy on my dresser," —then you're using your five senses!

Let's plan a trip!: Summer vacation is here! School is out for two months, and it's time to have some fun. Maybe your friends are going on vacation to someplace new, or just a trip to visit extended family. But where would you like to go?

Writing Prompt: If you could go anywhere, where would you go? It could be a place you've been before (your favorite store or a local park), somewhere you've always wanted to go (the Grand Canyon or Disneyland), or a place from your favorite story (like the Hundred Acre Wood). Or it can be a place you just invented. What about a city made out of gumdrops? Or a giant house full of kittens? It can be anywhere—you get to choose!

Some questions to get you started:

- ★ Use the five senses:
- ★ What do you see?
- ★ What do you touch?
- ★ What do you smell?
- ★ What do you hear?
- ★ What do you taste?
- ★ Would you take someone with you? If so, who? Or would you go by yourself?
- ★ Would you meet anyone there? (Someone who works at the theme park? Winnie the Pooh? A gingerbread man?)
- ★ What would you do in this place?
- ★ How long would you stay?

The Lord God made them all.

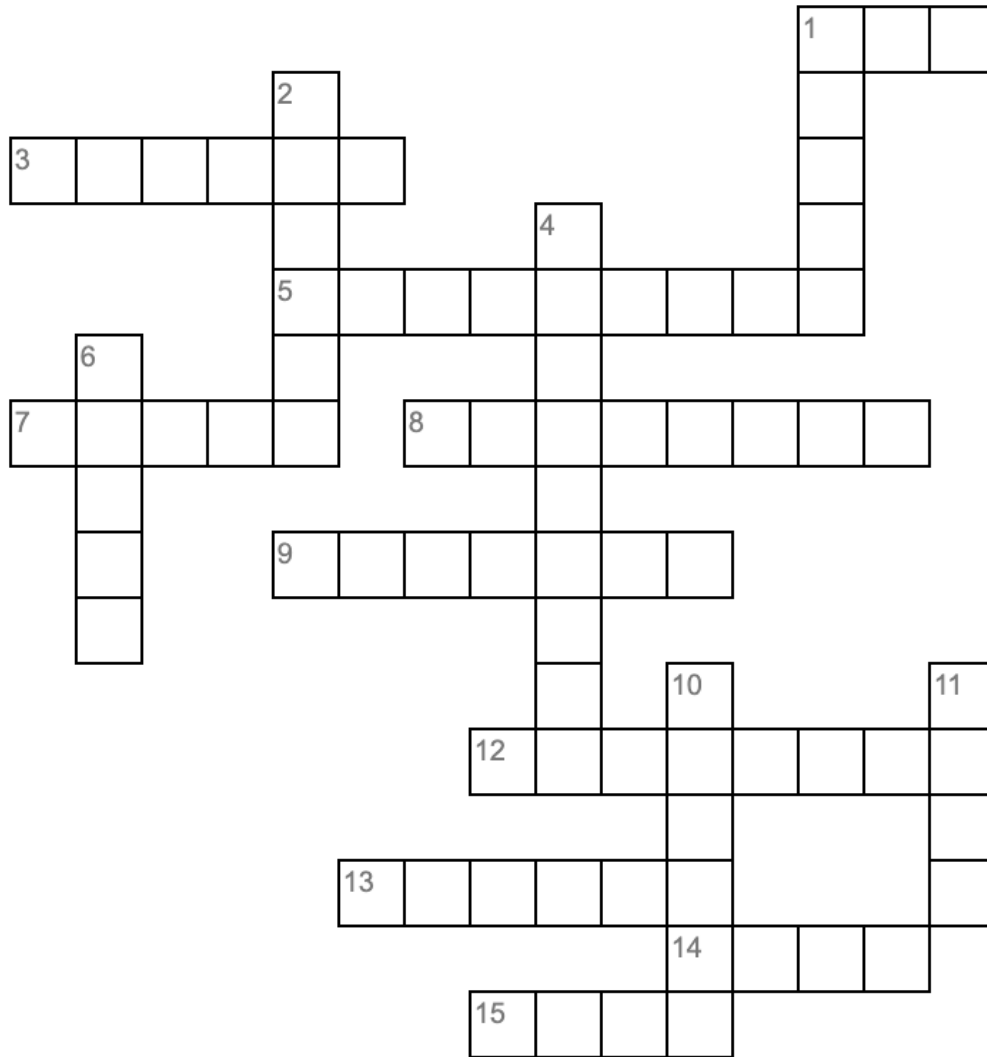
Each little flower that opens,

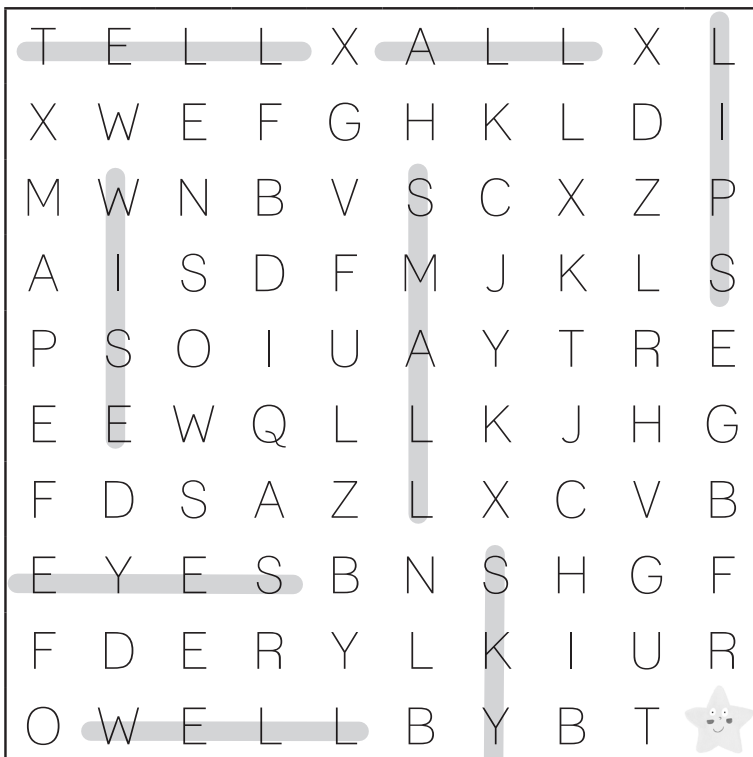

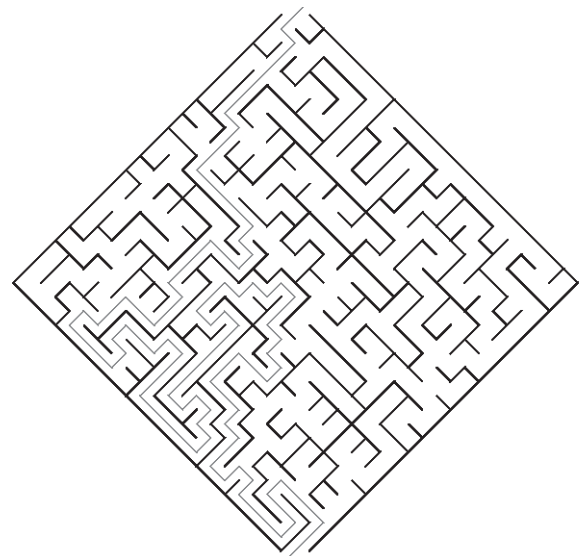
Butterfly Maze
