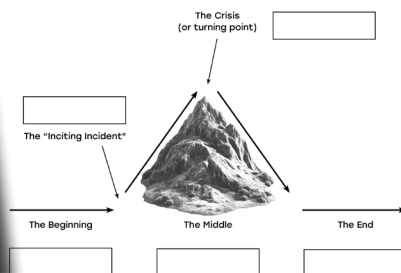

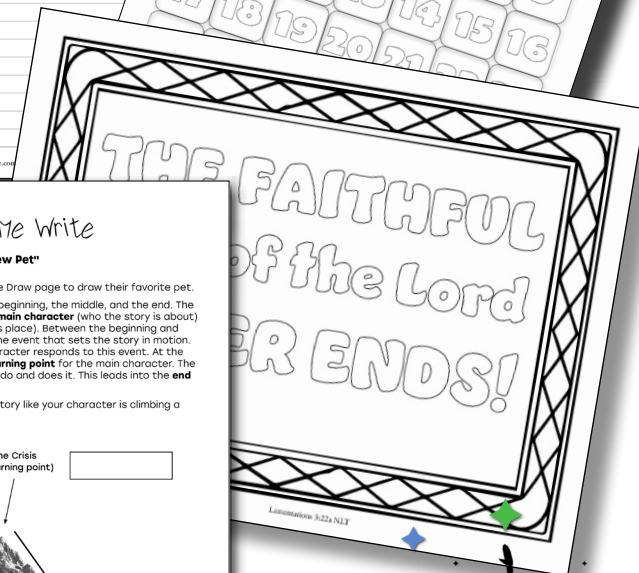

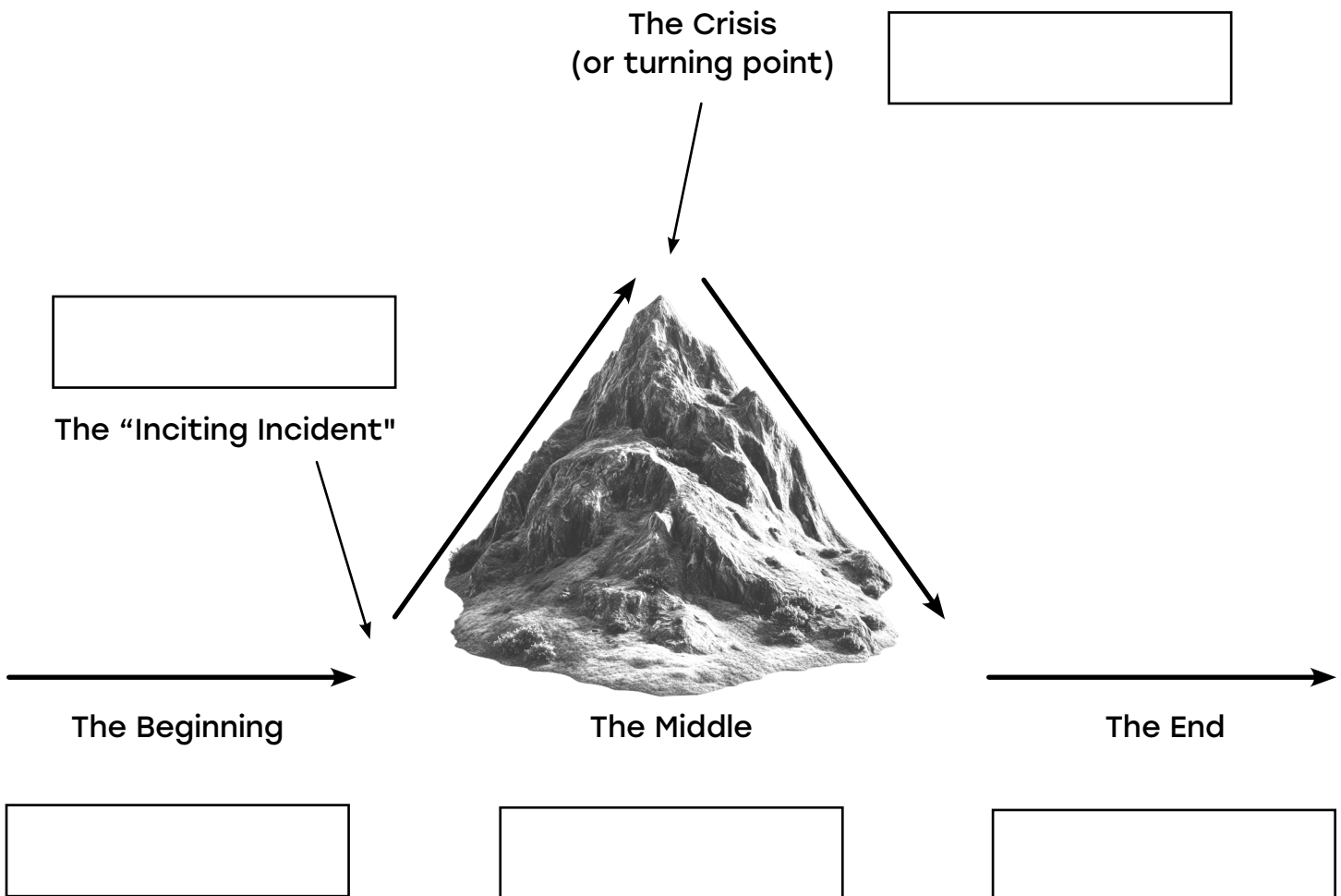
Watch Me Write

You can think about these parts of a story like your character is climbing a mountain:



Writing Prompt: Write a story about a character who gets a new pet. It can be their first pet, a pet they were asking for, or a total surprise.

For this story, the **beginning** is introducing the character, where he is, and what he is doing when he gets the new pet. The **inciting incident** is getting the pet. The **middle** of the story is how the character's life changes now that he has the pet. The **crisis or turning point** can be whatever you want it to be! Maybe the pet makes a mess, and the character has to clean it up. Maybe the pet chews up the character's shoes, and he has to find a different place to keep them. Or maybe the character is feeling overwhelmed with caring for the pet but finally figures out a plan. Then, the **end** of the story would be the character implementing his plan. It's up to you!

Some questions to get you started:

★ What is the character's name? How old is he?

★ Where does the story take place?

★ What kind of pet does the character get?

★ Describe the pet's personality. What does the character name it?

★ Did the character want the pet? Why did the character get the pet? Was it a special occasion, like a birthday?

★ How does the pet change the character's life/daily routines/chores?

What is Your Word in my life, Lord?

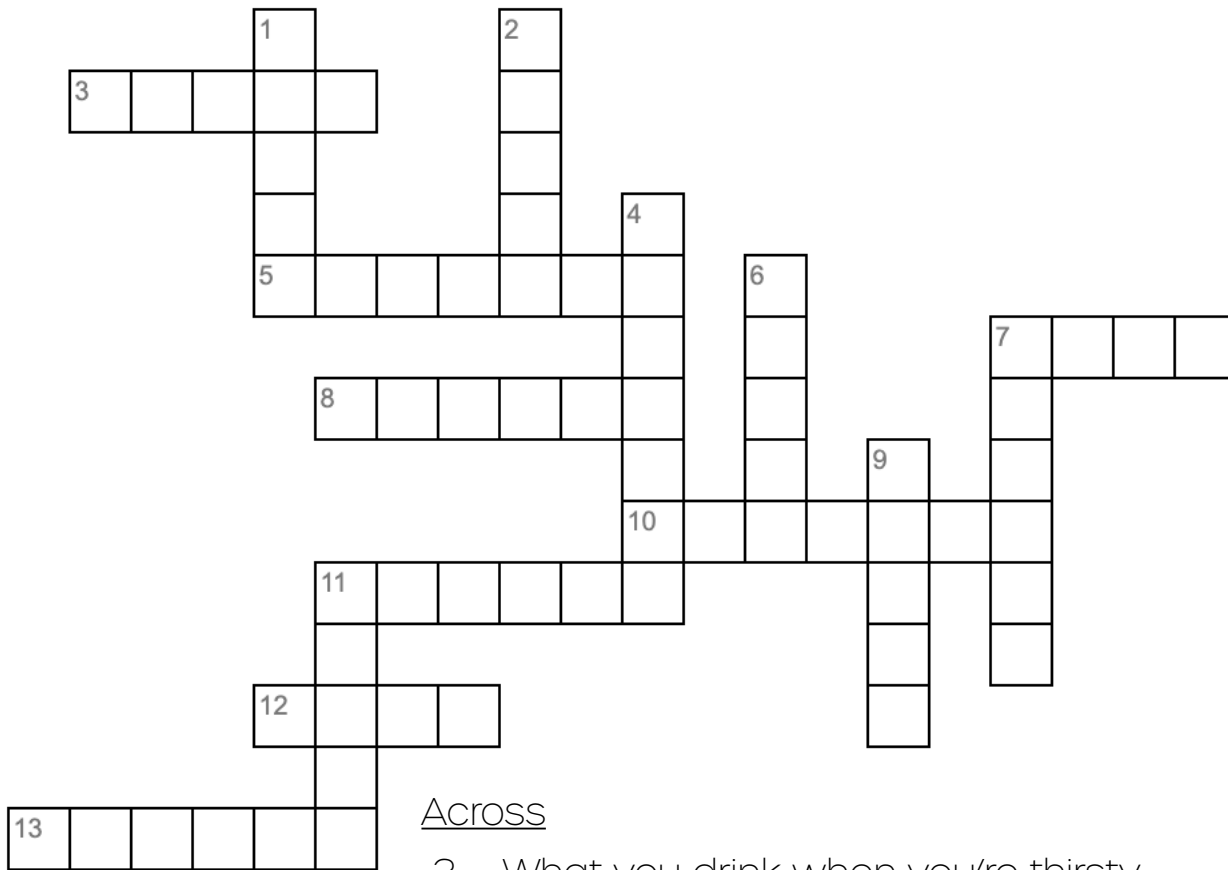
A sword that divides the truth from lies,

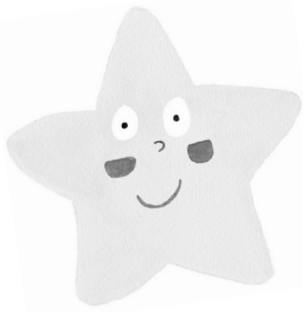

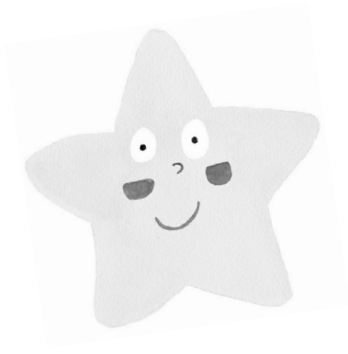

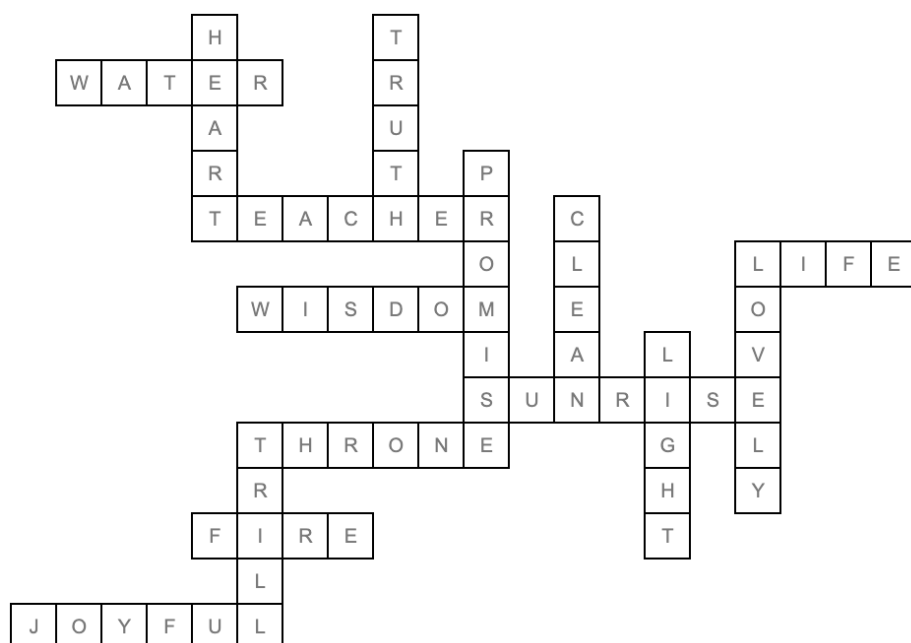
