

Watch Me Write

"A Fall Haiku"

For younger children, use the Watch Me Draw page to draw their favorite thing about fall.

In this issue of our magazine, you read a poem by Trine Grillo:

HOPE Autumn Aspen clings Last leaf snaps from frozen bones

Soon, fingertips bloom.

This type of poetry is called a *Haiku*. A Haiku is a tiny Japanese-style poem about a moment of time in nature. How do you say "Haiku"? It sounds like a sneeze: HI-KOO! (Bless you!)

It has three lines and follows a rule of 17 syllables.

Line one - 5 syllables Line two - 7 syllables

Line three - 5 syllables

But what's a syllable?

A syllable is a "beat" in a word. Try clapping while you say a word out loud. Each clap is one syllable!

Examples to help count syllables, you can mark them with dots:

You can use this table to keep track of your words and their syllables.




Draw a picture of a kinkajou climbing in a tree-don't forget the big eyes!


As you fill in letters, you'll start recognizing words. Use those solved letters to crack other words and reveal the full message!


